New Literacy Project

TNRP is joining forces with the Norfolk Community Foundation and the National Literacy Trust to boost reading in targeted schools in Thetford and Norwich. This initiative will provide training for new volunteers and lots of extra resources for the schools.

In addition, Jane James, Mayor ClIr of Thetford, who was key in bringing this new project to Norfolk, wants us to be her mayoral charity. We attended both the mayor-making ceremony and the Civic Reception in May to spread the word about what we do.

Our objective in Thetford is to provide at least two volunteers for each of the 10 chosen Thetford schools over the course of Mayor James' year in post. TNRP will train and provide its own Reading Support Volunteers whilst local businesses will be targeted for Employer-Supported Volunteers.

"The key to a fairer society is not to be locked out of schoolwork as a child, the jobs market as an adult or your own child's learning as a parent," said TNRP's Sarah Anthony in her speech at the Civic Reception.
