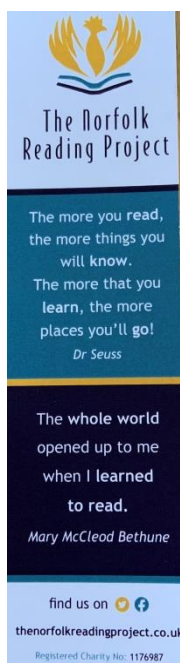


The Norfolk Reading Project

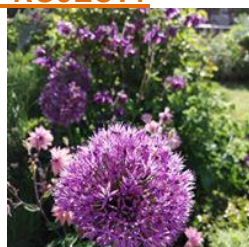
